

Third Announcement Global Legal and Sustainable Timber Forum, GLSTF 2024

11–12 September 2024 MGM COTAI, Macao SAR, China

Background

Recent development shows that the timber industry needs to collaborate even more closely among stakeholders including timber producers, buyers, processing industry and market players nationally and internationally. It must address issues in global timber supply chains arising from the post-pandemic and other uncertainties and must bridge the widening gap between demand and supply for wood products. It is also essential to sustain and enhance collaboration and exchange views and information, among timber industry stakeholders worldwide with the aim to building a sustainable collaborative platform in promoting legal and sustainable timber supply chains.

The ITTO's Legal and Sustainable Supply Chain (LSSC) Programme is aimed at building legal and sustainable supply chains. As part of the LSSC Program, ITTO and Macao SAR Commerce and Investment Promotion Institute (IPIM) are partners under a collaborative framework agreement to co-host the Global Legal and Sustainable Timber Forum (GLSTF), to accelerate the development of legal and sustainable timber supply chains.

The GLSTF inaugural forum 2023 was held on 21-22 November 2023 in Macao by the ITTO and IPIM in collaboration with the Global Green Supply Chains Initiative (GGSC). The GLSTF 2023 was the first global forum under this partnership focused on measures to be considered to improve the legality and sustainability of tropical timber supply chains. This milestone event brought together nearly 700 participants from 36 countries. The GLSTF 2024 is scheduled in September 2024 in Macao, providing continuity on these efforts on an annual basis.

Objective

The GLSTF 2024 aims to enhance networking, collaboration, and business exchange among timber industry stakeholders—producers, buyers, processors and market players to strengthen support for sustainable forest management, and the uptake of legal and sustainable wood product supply chains to facilitate the legal and sustainable use and trade

of wood products in a stable, transparent and predictable business environment while contributing to sustainable development and climate-change mitigation.

Date & Venue

11-12 September 2024 at the MGM COTAI, Macao SAR, China.

Co-hosts & Organizer

The GLSTF 2024 will be co-hosted by the ITTO and the IPIM and organized by the Secretariat of the GGSC. Specialized sub-forums will be co-organized by partner agencies and the ITTO, the IPIM and the GGSC.

Forum Structure

The GLSTF 2024 will have two components:

- 1) The Global Legal and Sustainable Timber Forum (main forum).
- 2) Four Specialized Sub-forums (sub-forums).

Theme & Topics

The theme of the GLSTF 2024 will be "Together Towards Reliable and Effective Global Timber Supply Chains".

The main forum will discuss topics related to reliable and stable timber resource supplies, trust and effectiveness along the timber supply chains and prospects for revitalizing global timber supply chains.

The specialized sub-forums will be organized by partner agencies, contributing to the theme, with selected topics on timber legality and sustainability; sustainable timber resources, markets and trade; advanced technology and machinery for wood processing; green finance and innovative facilitating measures.

Legal and Sustainable Timber Industry Display

A legal and sustainable timber industry display will be organized in parallel with the GLSTF 2024, at a scale of around 30 booths.

Other Events & Activities

The achievements of the Global Timber Index (GTI) and the Blockchain-based Timber Tracking System (BTTS) as well as others will be released at the GLSTF 2024. Other business activities and side events, such as B2B matchings, will be arranged accordingly.

Participants

The GLSTF 2024 is expected to attract around 700 participants from wood enterprises and trading companies, industrial and business associations, governments, international organizations, research institutions, etc.

Languages

The GLSTF 2024 will feature simultaneous interpretation in Chinese (Mandarin), English, French, Spanish and Portuguese.

I. Background

Forest-based enterprises and international timber trade add value to tropical forests and can contribute significantly to sustainable economies and livelihoods. For decades, tropical timber has grappled with numerous challenges and even threats as it struggles to maintain its stake in the international timber markets. It is now essential and urgent for tropical timber producing countries and the international tropical timber trade to adopt a positive and proactive approach to addressing the priority challenges of weak forest governance through clear and coherent strategies for reforming and strengthening forest governance and reining in illegal logging and trade more efficiently and effectively. This should form the basis for preparing the readiness of tropical timber producers to respond to emerging requirements of the international timber trade.

Tropical timber producer countries need to regularly assess the situation of competitiveness of their products in international markets to ensure continued maintenance of production

and trade of sustainably managed tropical timber and timber products. Ensuring sustainable tropical timber trade requires optimizing the utilization and improving productivity of production forests, which will, in turn, benefit conservation and protected forests, in terms of reducing pressures and disturbances. A key requirement of sustainability is compliance with all relevant legal frameworks. When timber is legally and sustainably produced, processed, traded, and used, the industry enhances the value of standing forests, greatly reducing the risk of deforestation, and making a major contribution to the achievement of the sustainable development goals.

The perception that illegal operations are widespread in tropical forests taints the image of the tropical timber sector in certain major import markets and while some markets have responded by tightening requirements for legality and sustainability to provide assurance for buyers and consumers for effective action in this regard. Concerned over illegal logging and its associated trade contribution to global deforestation and forest degradation and wishing not to be associated any longer with these persistent problems, major consumers have decided to enact laws to regulate their market, giving preference to legality and sustainability.

This specialized sub-forum will discuss issues related to timber legality and sustainability among different stakeholders in the context of the "EU Regulation 2023/1115 of the European Parliament and of the Council", or EUDR for short. This regulation will have a significant impact on the tropical timber trade in the EU, and it also has serious implications in tropical timber producing countries. The producer countries need to strengthen their monitoring and controlling system to ensure only legal and sustainable timber traded along supply chains by means of promoting the development of national schemes forest certification.

II. Terms of Reference

2.1 Purpose and Scope

The purpose of this specialized sub-forum is to share experiences and to learn from different points of views voiced by actors along the supply chains of timber and timber products on aspects related international timber trade requirements and national forest certification initiatives being developed by producer countries to ensure legality and sustainability of traded timber. Promoting the development of national schemes forest certification will facilitate respective authorities and business actors to deal with imposed trade requirements at both national and global scale.

The specialized sub-forum will be divided into two sessions: 1) Potential impacts on and responses to tropical timber producers towards emerging timber trade requirements (EUDR); 2) Updates on national forest certification schemes to support legal and sustainable supply chains.

Session 1: Potential impacts on and responses to tropical timber producers towards emerging timber trade requirements (EUDR)

The wood product sector now faces significant challenges with the implementation of the EUDR. In-depth discussions are already underway in many countries and sectors on how best to meet the requirements of the EUDR without adding unnecessary costs or leading to discrimination against certain operators.

Session 1 will update the status of producer countries' readiness towards the full implementation of EUDR. Regulation is of course essential to build legal and sustainable supply chains, but trade regulations in major timber consuming markets need to be consistent, and tropical countries need support and investment in capacity building to allow their continuing market access. There is a need for smart regulations that do not unnecessarily add transaction costs that might undermine the relative competitive position of legal and sustainable timber.

More importantly, we need to know whether and how far will the impact of these regulations be on efforts to combat illegal logging, poor governance, deforestation and forest degradation in the tropics and whether there are any significant unintended consequences that may arise for the tropical timber trade and industry.

This will lead to a synthesis of lessons that can inform the development and implementation of timber legality policies, strategies and action plans by governments, private sector, civil society organizations, SMEs and local communities.

<u>Session 2: Updates on national forest certification scheme to support legal and sustainable supply chains</u>

The Specialized Sub-forum 1 will also highlight the role of forest certification as the voluntary process whereby quality of forest management and production will be assessed against predetermined set of requirements to inform consumers about the sustainability of the forests from which wood and other forest products were produced.

In Session 2, the discussion will focus on national forest certification schemes development. Several selected producer countries will be invited to update their progress in developing the national forest certification. The potential of advanced technologies to be integrated for obtaining robust schemes will also be explored to support authorities and traders in identifying the legality and sustainability of traded timber and timber products along the supply chains.

Participants

150-200 participants are expected to represent government, business actors, trade and industry organizations, academics, and civil society. Ensuring diversity among stakeholders present at this event will allow for fruitful debate and strengthening of cross-sectoral collaboration and partnership.

2.2 Roles and Responsibilities of the organizer for Preparation and Carrying out the Specialized Sub-forum 1

The organizer, in consultation with the GGSC Secretariat as the forum organizer, will oversee the overall organization of the sub-forum.

The organizer will prepare the draft Session's agenda (including proposed Session's personnels: moderator, facilitators, speakers and rapporteurs) to be discussed and reviewed with the partner.

The organizer will share responsibility to invite Session's personnels. In coordination with GGSC and Macao IPIM, the organizer will liaise with the invitees for their traveling and accommodation arrangement.

The organizer will prepare the Session's report to be submitted to the Forum Organizer.

Creating Innovative Furniture and Smart Green Homes

Background

With the continuous expansion of the global furniture market, solid wood furniture and wood-based panel type furniture, as the two main types of furniture, are facing unprecedented opportunities and challenges in development. Solid wood furniture is favored for its natural texture and environmental characteristics, while wood-based panel type furniture wins market share with its cost-effectiveness and design flexibility. At present, the manufacturing technology of solid wood and wood-based panel type furniture is undergoing rapid innovation and development. Technological innovation has driven the transformation from manual to CNC machines, intelligent production lines, improving production efficiency and product quality, while reducing material waste and environmental pollution. Driven by environmental regulations and consumers' demand for a healthy lifestyle, sustainable development has become a key to the industry.

In order to promote the innovative application of wood processing technology and mechanical equipment in the furniture industry, and to promote the development of the industry in a more efficient, environmentally friendly and intelligent direction. Under the framework of the Global Legal and Sustainable Wood Industry Summit 2024 (GLSTF2024), the Forum continues to be held in Macau to continue to contribute to these goals.

Purpose

Background

In GLSTF 2023, a sub-forum was held on "Green Finance and Innovative Facilitating Measures for Green Supply Chains", which is the first specialized forum for green finance of the timber industry in Macao. This Sub-forum was organized by Global Green Supply Chain of Forest Products (Macao) Federation (Macao Federation) and Luso International Banking Ltd, aiming at establishing an inter-promotional industrial environment of "Finance + Industry + Ecology".

In GLSTF 2023, representatives from the Macao government, international organizations, and financial institutions jointly witnessed the signing ceremony of the "Green Finance Facilitating Green Supply Chain Cooperation Agreement" between the Macao Federation and three of China's most important home furnishing and building materials industry clusters. This is to leverage the advantages of the Macao Federation in digital traceability, capital matching, and international cooperation, so as to organize enterprises and industrial parks in producing countries to carry out "forest-to-consumer" cooperation.

The forestry industry has long supply chains and covers a variety of products. Sustainable forest management and green supply chains are "nature-based solutions" to combating forest deforestation and degradation. However, investing in forestry is insufficient because of the long payback period, low returns, and strong externalities. Currently, a large amount of costs arising from fulfilling social responsibilities are borne by the private sector itself. The ecological value of forest products is difficult to realize, which restricts the development of small and

medium-sized forestry enterprises. How to solve the problem of "where does the money come from"? How to motivate the supply chain finance to invest in the forestry sector? How to promote the realization of the ecological value of forest products through financial services? The resolution of these issues requires the joint efforts of governments, social organizations, financial institutions, and enterprises, and other stakeholders to form a systematic solution for supply chain finance to support the global forest sustainability.

The theme of Sub-Forum 4 in GLSTF 2024 will be "New Financial Opportunities in Forest Sustainability". This Sub-forum will be co-organized by the Macao Federation, Central African Forest Initiative (CAFI), and the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macau Greater Bay Area-Green Finance Alliance (GBA-GFA). This Sub-forum will take the sustainable development of global forests as a specific scenario, inviting policy makers, forestry enterprises, business associations, technology companies, certification bodies, and philanthropic funds, to jointly explore the construction of global ecological partnerships that empower both finance and sustainable forestry development. It aims to provide industry demonstrations for green finance to support sustainable development.

Objectives

This forum aims to establish a high-level dialogue platform between financial institutions and forestry stakeholders, inviting representatives from international organizations, multilateral trust funds, multilateral development banks, policy banks, commercial banks, enterprises, business associations, and certification bodies to discuss and exchange ideas. It seeks innovation in institutional mechanisms, policy systems, industrial models, and financial products, and explores systematic solutions for green finance to support the sustainable development of forestry. Meanwhile, this sub-forum aims to provide a platform for financial institutions and enterprises that adhere to sustainable management. It seeks to explore new business opportunities, discover new potential, and jointly build a better future for sustainable development.
